HOW IT WORKS

Over 1 million gallons of paint recycled since 1992 and still going strong, Metro collects leftover latex paint through its hazardous waste program. After collection, every can is first inspected for quality, then sorted by color. Colors are blended in batches of up to 1,000 gallons, filtered, lab tested for safety and performance, and poured into one-gallon cans and five-gallon pails for resale.

DID YOU KNOW?

For every gallon of recycled paint you use instead of new paint, you:

- Save an estimated 100 kilowatt hours of energy.
- Help prevent pollution from the mining and extraction of raw materials.
- Conserve water used in the manufacture of paint.
- Reduce the need for landfill space.

USE INSIDE OR OUT

MetroPaint is made from a combination of acrylics and enamels with various glosses, which makes it very durable and suitable for use both inside and outside.

APPLICATION

After properly prepping the surface, use a brush, roller or paint sprayer. MetroPaint has been filtered to industry standards for convenient and easy spray application. See paint label or product data sheet for more information.

Proper preparation and priming of all surfaces is recommended.

COVERAGE

Usually covering in just one coat, each gallon of MetroPaint covers between 300 and 400 square feet, depending on the surface to be painted and application method.
